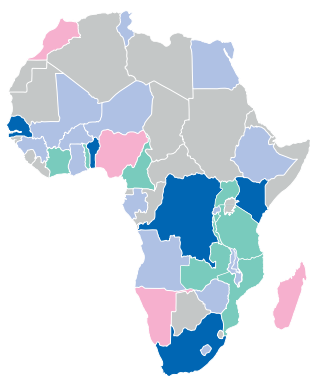


AFRICA, LATIN AMERICA & ASIA 2025

The King Baudouin Foundation (KBF), deeply rooted in Belgium and a member of the Myriad alliance for borderless giving, operates on a global scale. It aims to drive change in Africa, Latin America and Asia, through financial support, sharing best practices, networking and donor assistance.

This info sheet provides some key data on KBF's support in these three continents in 2025, but also a focus on efforts in its four African priority countries, Benin, Burundi, the DR Congo and Senegal.

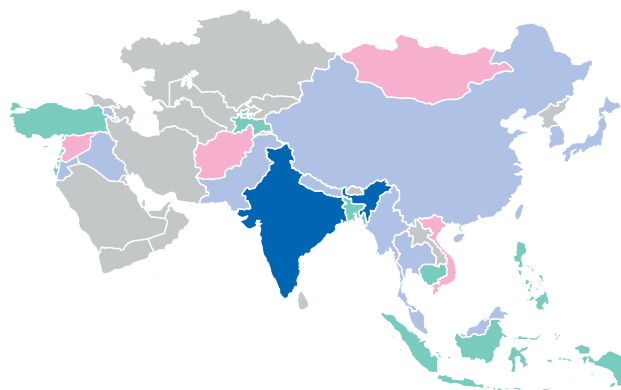

Countries in which the KBF awarded grants in 2025, by total amount: ● < €100K ● > €100K ● > €200K ● > €1M

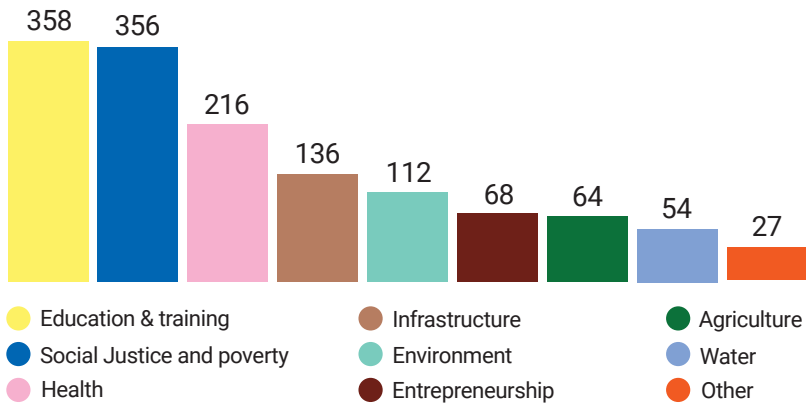

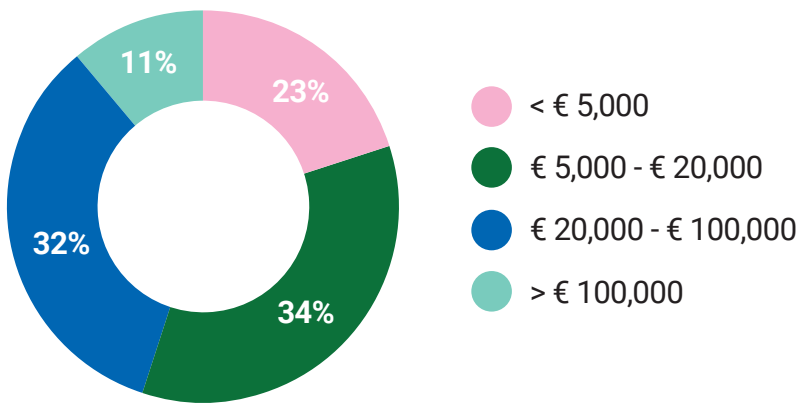

2025 Distribution of grants by theme

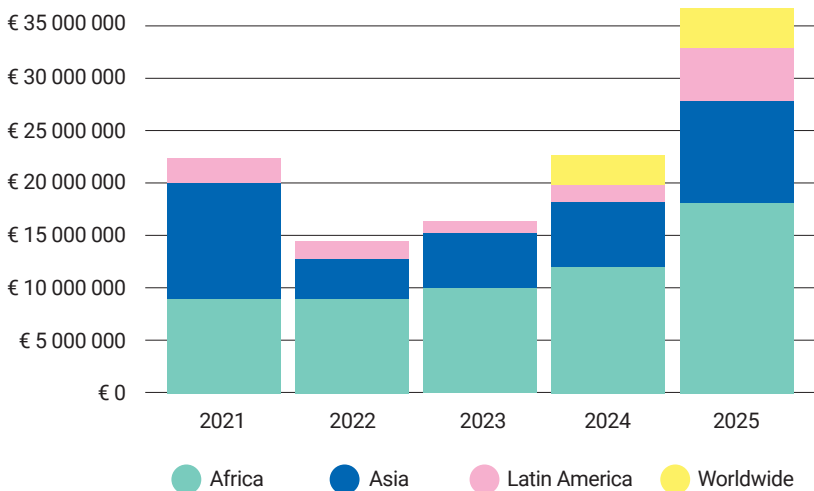


One grant may cover multiple themes, which explains why the sum exceeds 593 grants.

In 2021, KBF's engagement increased significantly in response to the COVID-19 crisis. Several philanthropic Funds responded massively to solidarity needs on all continents, and in particular in India.

Since 2024, we took into account the increase in grants spanning multiple continents by adding the category 'Worldwide'.

In 2025, the noticeable increase in the total grant amount is largely explained by two new Donor Advised Funds that provided significant support.

FOCUS COUNTRIES

The King Baudouin Foundation is making a global impact, with a strong focus on Africa. In 2025, 50% of its international engagements within the regions covered by this infosheet were attributed to Africa.

KBF manages a variety of philanthropic Funds, most of them with their own specific thematic or geographical priorities. Besides these donor-driven Funds, KBF combines the means of

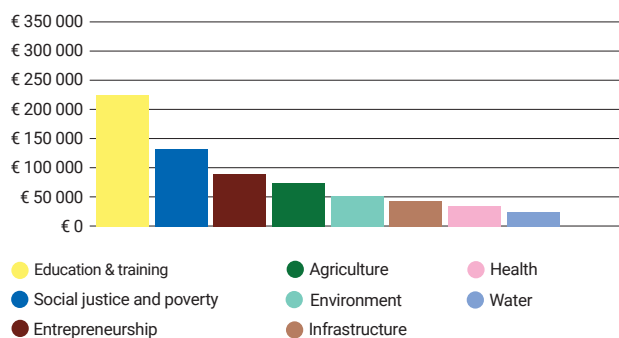
some less-earmarked Funds with similar objectives around three themes: Health, Training and Entrepreneurship, and Environment. These three pooled funds strategically channel significant resources towards local organisations in four focus countries in Africa: Burundi, the DR Congo, Benin and Senegal.

The below snapshot presents the key figures of KBF's overall financial support in these four countries.

BURUNDI

14 grants were awarded, benefiting 14 organisations, for a total amount of € 650,359

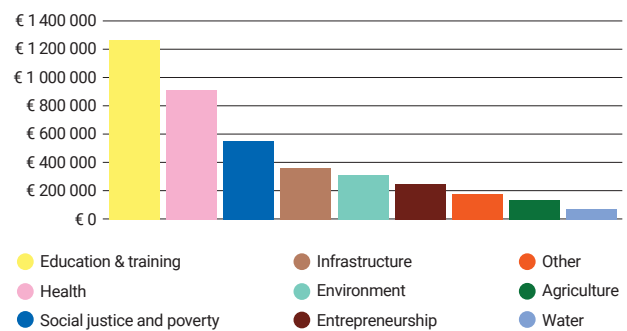
Themes by amount

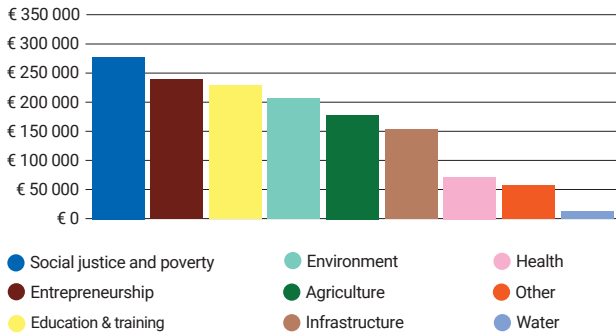

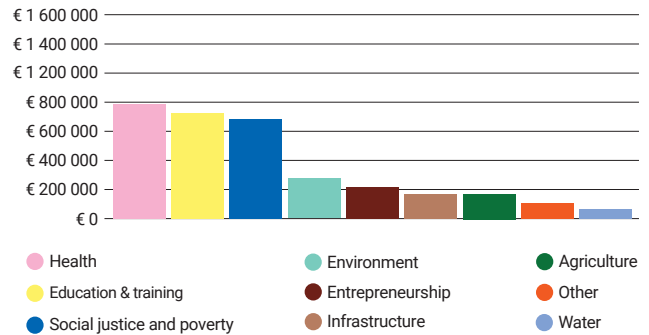
Themes by amount
